

## VII. Local Rules - LOLL American and National League

The green book outlines all rules. Outlined below are local LOLL rules.

- 1. A player who has attained league age of twelve (12) is not eligible to pitch in the NL.
- 2. In the NL the 5-mun per inning maximum rule (hereinafter referred to as 5-Run Mercy Rule) will be observed. There is no 5-Run Per inning Mercy Rule in the AL. There is a 10-Run Mercy Rule in both the AL and NL
  - a. The 10-Run Mercy Rule shall be applied in the AL and NL as hereinafter defined. If either team has a lead of 10 runs or more after the  $4^{th}$  or  $5^{th}$  inning is completed in its entirety, or the home team has the 10-run lead after the first half of the 4th or 5th inning, the team with the lead of 10 runs or more shall be declared the winner and each team shall vacate the dugout.
- 3. Pitching rules: See Green Book Section VI. (Review pitcher & catcher guidelines)
  - In addition to the green book, LOLL has a local guideline and rule where no National League pitcher may pitch more than six innings in a week (Sunday - Saturday)
  - In a week (Sun-Sat) where a team has 4 or more league games scheduled because of rescheduled games, pitchers will be able to pitch a maximum of 8 innings (with required days rest). In the event any of the four scheduled games is rained out, then the teams affected by the rain outs shall revert to the 6 innings per week per pitcher maximum as defined above. Rain out is defined as not starting a game.



- IF upon receipt of the game report on "innings pitched per week" a violation becomes evident, the offending team will forfeit that game regardless of a protest or no protest. The board reserves the right to exercise judgment in each case.
- 4. Defensively every National League player will be allowed, as a minimum, one inning as an infield player, in the first 4 innings of the game. Safety exception is allowed on consultation with parents and commissioner. For American League & National League no player shall sit on the bench for more than 2 innings per 6 inning game, those innings shall not be consecutive. Behavior exemptions are allowed, parents shall be advised.
- 5. We will bat the roster. All players will bat whether they are in the game defensively or not.

- 6. Games shall last 6 innings, if time permits.
  - Commissioners may set game time limits. Rev 11/8/16, v1.1
  - AL time limits/requirements (March 2017 AL Commissioner) Rev 03/30/17, v1.2
  - a. Weeknight Games
    - 1. No NEW inning may start after 1 hour and 45 minutes from the actual start time.
    - 2. If you start an inning you finish it "No time limit" (city lights out @10:00pm)
      - a) Be respectful of following game.
    - 3. For the purposes of this rule, weeknight game start times shall include <u>Sunday 4:01pm</u> thru <u>Thursday</u>

## b. Weekend Games



- 1. No NEW inning may start after 2 hours from the actual game start time.
- 2. If you start an inning you finish it "No time limit" (city lights out @10:00pm)
  - a) Be respectful of following game.
- 3. For the purposes of this rule, weekend game start times shall include <u>Friday thru Sunday 4:00pm</u>.

## Note:

- 1. If you encounter a "city lights out" either:
  - (a) |Finish next day
  - (b)  $0^{\rm lr}_{\rm r}$  both managers agree to revert back to previous inning score.
- 2. Start Time is the actual recorded time immediately before the umpire indicates play and <u>NOT</u> the scheduled game time. Actual start time is recorded by the HOME BOOK Keeper with agreement from umpire.
- a. Please be sure you all know the <u>recorded start time</u> so it doesn't become an issue at the end of your game. Home Book is responsible for recording the start time so please be sure your book keeper know this.
- 7. Managers, coaches, players and team members' parents may coach the bases
- 8. It is the managers' responsibility to not let intimidation of umpires and players become a problem.
- 9. For NL, LOLL <u>prohibits</u> the "delayed steal of home." If a runner attempts this, and is put out, the runner is out. If the runner is not put out, the runner is not declared out but is asked to return to third base.
- 10. Complete game is defined as more than 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  innings.



- 11. Rainouts may be made up. It is both managers' responsibility to work with Scheduling Coordinator to secure a field and time for make-up games.
- 12. Nine (9) players are the minimum for the game to be played. If less than 9 players show up to play a game that has not been rescheduled, that team will forfeit their game. If Managers of the team choose, they can share players and play an unofficial game during their scheduled time. If the manager has a situation where they can't field a team, and they know ahead of time, they can substitute "like players" and play the game
- 13. First Aid kits, ice packs, shall be present in dugout at every game & practice. Also medical release forms & concussion waiver for each player.
